



## Day of Giving for Ruth M. Smith Center

Given over 100 years ago to Methodist Women by a grieving family who had lost their daughter Ruth, the Ruth M. Smith Center has been in ministry ever since. Beginning as an orphanage, then a home for at-risk youth, it is now a personal care home for 28 adults from many surrounding counties. Those adults range in age from 30 to 70; most have mental disabilities; none can pay their full way. No one is turned away because they can't pay.

About 1/3 of the budget comes from grants and benevolent giving by people like you. The biggest fund raiser every year occurs during **WarrenGives**, a one day on-line giving event in May. Local philanthropic groups in Warren County match a portion of what is given to increase the funds coming to each participating non-profit. From \$10 to \$1000 donations receive the additional money.
