## Breakthrough Prayer

In her book, Open Road, the Adventure of a Breakthrough Prayer Initiative, Rev. Sue Nilson Kibbey asks you to consider whether you think of your church as an organization, or a movement.

What might happen if we started thinking of our church as a movement? A movement is defined as "a rapid progression of events," or "a series of actions and activities trending toward a new direction?" Our church right now is entering a new and exciting time, and we should be open to what God will do through us.

She points out that the prayer that always works is "Thy Will Be Done." Basically a breakthrough prayer is this prayer phrased another way. This moves a congregation from managing logistics to participating in a Spiritual movement. Often our prayers focus on needs-the needs of our family, our friends, or ourselves. A breakthrough prayer invites God to miraculously break through, open new doors, and usher in new possibilities. We ask God how we are to follow God's will in new ways.

Join us next Sunday, March 26, from 9:00-9:30 a.m., to find out more about breakthrough prayer, and together write a prayer to be used with our congregation as we move forward to what God is calling us to be. Tawni Betts will facilitate the discussion on the $26^{\text {th }}$.
